Dear Friends,

Halloween is now behind us. The anticipation of Christmas glows on the horizon like the eastern sky before dawn. And, the season of Thanksgiving is upon us, like a welcomed guest with a warm pumpkin pie to share. The days of gratitude are here. But, are we feeling grateful?

For some of us, gratitude is an expression that comes as naturally to us as taking a breath. For others among us, gratitude is a discipline, a learned habit accomplished only through diligent practice. But, unfortunately, for some us, gratitude generally eludes us. We know we should focus on our blessings instead of our curses, but knowing that truth in our minds and living that truth out in our relationships are two different things. And, for us, the words of the Apostle Paul to the church in Thessalonica ring hollowly in our ears:

"Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." - 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

Here are some practical tips for gratitude that have been shared with me throughout the years. Some of these tips I practice as often as I can. Some, I have been rather negligent in my daily routine. So, take heart if you feel you need to be more grateful. I share your struggle. These tips are for myself as much as they are for you...

- 1. Be thankful for little things. We tend to take many things for granted: our home, clean water, access to education, etc. When we practice gratitude for small things, our gratitude for those big moments will become natural.
- 2. End each day with gratitude. Don't go to bed angry. Before going to sleep, think back on your day and be grateful for each moment and blessing.
- 3. Look inward and give thanks for who you are. Remember, God created you GOOD! Appreciate your positive attributes. God has blessed you and you are WORTHY of those blessings.
- 4. Gratitude is an expression to God. So often, we get bogged down in our prayers with negativity, trials, sickness and worries. Don't get me wrong, we need to take our concerns to God as well. But, all too often, we forget to take our gratitude to God. Did you appreciate that piece of pumpkin pie? Thank the person who

brought it. But, don't forget to thank the one who created that pumpkin to begin with!

I believe if we spent as much time in prayer thanking God for specific blessings (and of course for the gift of his son, Jesus Christ) as we do in prayer with our concerns, we would all become people of gratitude.

Thank you for all of your blessings to me and thanks be to God!
